

The volunteer activities of the nominee must exemplify the spirit of our mission to improve the quality of life in the communities where we live or work by supporting organizations that address vital community needs and issues in the areas of human services, animal welfare and the environment.



Mark Stowell and family members support several nonprofits in the community near the Irvine Office, including From Maddi's Closet (dedicated to supporting children with cancer) and Grandma's House of Hope (fighting homelessness and poverty in Orange County). The family never hesitates to get involved in local causes, making quilts for fundraisers, tending to the elderly and sick within their community and generously donating to causes about which they feel passionately.



José Gutierrez is an inspirational role model to Seattle employees, friends and family. He is often found providing homemade food directly to those in need, collecting and distributing clothing and lending a hand in local home rebuilding projects through ReBuilding Together Seattle. 

SEATTLE GIVES BACK

REBUILDING TOGETHER SEATTLE

With its mission to "repair homes, revitalize communities, and rebuild lives," Rebuilding Together Seattle was an easy pick to receive a grant from the Seattle Giving Committee! The committee wanted to go a step further and partner with them in the fall of 2018 by hosting a Rebuilding Day.

The Deacon team paired up with an elderly resident, Ann, who was at risk of having to move out of her home. Ann had owned her home since 1976 and had growing maintenance and accessibility issues. The Deacon team began with a modest list of requested repairs and an overall budget of \$5,000. However, Ann's actual wish list of repairs was much longer. The team shifted into high gear quickly, securing donations from subcontractors to keep material costs down and dividing the extended workday into hourly sections to efficiently coordinate volunteers and subcontractors. Because the work was completed on a Saturday, the Foundation matched the employees' volunteer hours at \$20/hr.

The final result: twenty-four items on the owner's extended wish list were tackled and completed in one day. With our initial \$5,000 grant and one day of volunteer work, we were able to provide almost \$13,000 of repairs plus a donation of \$3,500 back to Rebuilding Together! The event was such a success, and our team members still talk about what a terrific day it was.

GIVES BACK

COMMUNITY TRANSITIONAL SCHOOL

Located in the outer Northeast neighborhood of Portland, the Community Transitional School (CTS) is unique in its mission to "provide at-risk children with a stable educational environment that promotes their academic and personal growth." In this case, the most significant risk factor for these children is that they are homeless. The Community Transitional School meets them wherever they are, dispatching buses to wherever the child is located. It could be a curbside parked car, a homeless shelter or the apartment of a friend of the family.

The Portland Giving Committee is proud to have supported this program each year since 2012. One of our key initiatives these past two years has been to push beyond just providing grant funding and take more action. In September of 2019, CTS was selected as the recipient of our office-wide Back-to-School Drive. Instead of asking our employees to bring in materials, we encouraged them to donate directly to CTS and submit the receipt for a Matching Grant of 2:1, allowing their donations to go even further. Each donor named their favorite children's book and placed that on our growing scoreboard (one book for \$20 meant a total of three books, thanks to our Matching Grant). Not only was this an engaging conversation piece in our lobby, but it also built awareness of our matching grant program with our new employees. Ultimately we were able to provide almost \$2,000 of school supply money to the school, over and above the \$4,000 grant provided to them earlier in the year.

GIVES BACK

FOSTERHOPE SACRAMENTO

Helping Children and Families has long been the highest priority for the Sacramento Giving Committee, and one particular organization has succeeded in touching their hearts these past two years. FosterHope Sacramento is a therapeutic foster care center for children, teens and families. In 2018 this organization was invited to apply for a grant, and they described their need for a fence to surround a 15,000 sf lawn at their facility. Without a fence, the children were in danger due to a busy street. The Sacramento Giving Committee provided some funding for the fence, but it wasn't quite enough to complete the job because the scope of the fence project had expanded to enclose a patio. The organization came back in 2019 with a request for additional funding. Not only did the Committee provide a larger grant to ensure the project's completion, they also connected the organizer to a subcontractor that supplied materials within the organization's budget, and provided the manpower to install the fence!

Deacon field and office employees worked side by side with office leaders to dig fence posts and install fencing to ensure that the children had access to the beautiful lawn and trees. FosterHope Sacramento was their highlighted organization this year and, along with the fence, was the recipient of our Back to School Drive donating backpacks and school supplies. Additionally, the Sacramento Committee selected FosterHope's "Letters to Santa" program as their holiday drive, providing gifts to twenty children, based on the letters they had written to Santa.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF GARDEN GROVE

The Irvine Giving Committee has been working with the Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove for several years, supporting their summer enrichment opportunities for community children. Their programs work to address the learning loss that occurs in communities when kids are out of school for the summer.

In 2018 the organization asked if the Deacon Charitable Foundation would be willing to fund and staff a "Fun Friday Carnival" for these children. The event would bring several clubs together at one site to participate in unique activities that promote physical fitness, art, science and mentorship through interactive experiences. This sparked a lot of interest by Irvine employees and the Fun Friday Carnival became a day-long community service project for employees and their families. It was the highest turnout of employees of all community service days! Between tending the BBQ, running the jumpy slides, leading art projects, and cleaning cotton candy off sticky little fingers, the employees were kept busy, and the smiles were contagious.

An added benefit to this event was the large volume of service hours provided by Deacon employees and their family members. Their hours were matched, allowing the Foundation to provide an additional donation to the Boys and Girls Club of Garden Grove afterwards!




