EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S LETTER

"What a year it was!"

Some form of that sentence begins almost every annual letter from the nonprofits we have funded up and down the West Coast. Nonprofits have been hit hard by the pandemic-induced recession and by the lockdown of the volunteers who normally support them. The need for support in our communities is vast and growing. I am so grateful that the Deacon Charitable Foundation has continued serving the communities where our employees live or work.

While our volunteer events diminished in 2020 due to COVID-19 lockdowns, our employees' commitment did not. In 2020, participation in the employee matching program doubled to thirty percent: 1 in 3 employees has donated money or time (or both!) to organizations that serve their community. Also, the dollars donated by employees in 2020 are almost double that of 2019 – a massive achievement during an extremely stressful and challenging year!

This is a time of looking back for me, as I am retiring, and this will be my last letter and my final annual report. I'm proud of our employee-volunteers and our Board of Directors' accomplishments since I joined the organization as Executive Director in February of 2014. We have increased our employees' involvement and have developed a variety of programs to celebrate their commitment to our communities. We have revitalized our ability and desire to do in-kind building projects and have completed several such projects in recent years. I continue to be impressed by the thoughtfulness and vision of the Co-Chairs of our office Giving Committees who lead our grantmaking process, organize events and activities, and identify partnerships with organizations in keeping with the priorities of the employees.

I am excited to announce that one such Co-Chair, Veronica Wences, will be succeeding me as the next Executive Director. Veronica has been involved in the Orange County Giving Committee ever since she joined Deacon fifteen years ago, and she has been a co-leader of the Committee for eight years. I am so grateful to the Board for giving us this year to work together and to bring her up to speed on nonprofit management. It is truly an honor to work with her, and I know you will be in good hands as we move into the fall, when I plan to retire from the Foundation.

I have pasted a quote from Jonas Salk over my home office desk, for this is how many of us are working these days: "*If* we want to be good ancestors, we should show future generations how we coped with an age of great change and great crises." This has been a year of great change and great crises, and I am proud that our people have weathered it so successfully. It has been a reminder of how interconnected we all are and how much we have to give – to each other, and to our communities.

Deacon continues to highlight and celebrate employees and their families for the charitable work in their communities. The Deacon Charitable Foundation is pleased to introduce Andy and Kim Davis and their sons Zane and Colton as our 2020 Deacon Community Go-Giver.

The Davis family has been supporting their Patterson, CA community for many years. They provide weekly groceries to a woman who was critically injured in a car accident, have built a trellis to provide shade for an elderly man with Alzheimer's, have been helping to maintain yards of several disabled families in their community – and much more! Brian King, who nominated the family, says, "Andy's family's charity work provides a sense of generational continuity and connection in their community."

Andy and his family have chosen to donate their \$1000 award to Naomi's House in Patterson, California. Naomi's House is a shelter for homeless women who want to change their circumstances but need support to get back on their feet.

SEATTLE

Our Seattle employees supported foster children in February through Amara. They raised \$3,440 through employee donations plus Foundation matching grants to purchase duffel bags for kids to travel with their belongings to their new homes. The employees enjoyed filling the giant heart on the wall to overflowing, representing each employee's donation.

PORTLAND

Portland employees also supported foster children through Project Never Again. They raised enough money for almost 200 duffel bags for foster children and gathered together to create "Courage Cards" to share some encouragement and good wishes. These cards are placed in each duffel bag and are given to foster children all over Oregon, as they transition to their new homes.

SACRAMENTO & PLEASANTON

This year Sacramento Giving Committee organized two events for Share the Love: the CityTeam shelter in Oakland, and Loaves & Fishes in Sacramento. Both organizations provide food for the homeless and for those struggling to get back on their feet. At CityTeam, our employees working in the Bay Area served food and cleaned the kitchen on Presidents Day when the job sites were closed. At Loaves & Fishes there were seven people from our Sacramento office serving food to the homeless.



ORANGE COUNTY

Orange County employees continued this Share the Love theme of creating cards, but for a local veteran who, at age 104, was in need of some Valentine love. After a friend of his launched a social media campaign dubbed "Operation Valentine", seeking to get 104 Valentines sent to Major Bill White, our employees joined in the effort, resulting in over 200,000 Valentines from all over the world!




