#### **LETTER**

Dear Friends,

Looking back at 2021, it felt like a year of adjustment to a new way of navigating our lives brought to us by the pandemic. Despite all of the challenges, we figured out a way to maintain our tradition and momentum of giving. COVID may have kept us physically apart, but it didn't separate us from our mission. I like to think that those challenges will inspire us to grow as people to find new ways to uplift our communities during challenging times.

At the beginning of last year, we asked everyone, via our Annual Employee Survey, what areas were most important to them and their families for giving; the response was impressive with 86% of employees completing the Survey! Based on a suggestion we heard in the survey, a new program was developed this year, the People's Choice Award. This program selects one organization that was recommended in the survey, from each office, to receive a grant of \$3,000. It was very exciting to use input from our people to develop a new way of supporting our communities.

It was admirable that employees continued to participate in the Employee Matching Program, even with the state-wide COVID closures. We again broke the record for the most amount matched since the beginning of the Foundation. I am thankful to my predecessor, Julie Earnest for the time she took to train and mentor me all year, to the Board of Directors for their ongoing support, to the Co-Chairs of each committee for their continued commitment, and to the Deacon Construction employees for the work they do that enables the Deacon Charitable Foundation to fulfill its mission.

In the coming year, I hope to be of support and inspire the local committees and be a source of information to employees.



## 2021 HIGHLIGHTS



#### **Deacon Community Go-Giver 2021**

Deacon continues to highlight and celebrate employees and their families for the charitable work they do in their communities. The Deacon Charitable Foundation Board is pleased to introduce John and Janet Martorano as Deacon Community Go-Givers.

John has been involved with City Team for over five years now. In addition to his work with City Team, John, and his wife Janet, volunteer at the San Francisco-Marin Food Bank, getting food out to vulnerable neighbors in the community. In addition, they have long been supporters of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Together We Rise. This year he spearheaded an in-kind project to rebuild a bathroom – alongside his son, Nic, and other Deacon employees – at a facility for women displaced from their homes by violence. John and Janet have decided to split their \$2000 award to three charities close to their hearts: CityTeam Oakland, Together We Rise, and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

When asked how he and his family choose where to focus their giving, his response was simple: "People. Helping our fellow man. It's so important."

#### **City Team Bathroom Renovation**

The scope of work consisted of completely gutting the bathroom, new sheetrock, shower enclosure, fixtures cabinets, fan, flooring, sinks, toilet, all plumbing valves and fixtures and new flooring. Most of the supplies were donated by local subcontractors, the Project Manager time was donated, and Deacon employees maximize their volunteer time by utilizing the Employee Matching Program for a matching amount of almost \$2,000 to CityTeam.

#### Winter Fundraising Drives

The Sacramento office held a holiday drive benefiting Berkeley Food Network, a nonprofit with the goal of ending hunger in Berkeley, CA. With \$1,235 in employee donations and an additional \$2,170 donated through the matching program, we were able to more than DOUBLE our goal with a total contribution of \$3,405!!

In February the Portland office held a drive to benefit Oregon Worker Relief Fund that provides financial support directly to Oregonians who have lost their jobs yet are ineligible for Unemployment Insurance and federal stimulus relief due to their immigration status, and now face hunger, homelessness, and economic hardship. Thanks to your generosity, and to the Deacon Charitable Foundation 2:1 matching grant program, we EXCEEDED our goal and raised \$3,090 toward relief for our immigrant workers, friends, and families!

This holiday season the Seattle office participated in a virtual toy drive benefiting the families supported by Mary's Place, a nonprofit inclusive shelter and services that support women, children and families on their journey out of homelessness. The Seattle office raised \$805 in donations, which after the Foundation's matching our overall donations totalled \$2,415! Exceeding the goal!


